	Crook's Lane, Chester was his first chapel whither he went in August 1826. He left in 1833 to be co-pastor with Dr.Lant Carpenter at Lewin's Mead chapel, Bristol, where on 21 October that year, he married JANE HIBBERT, and established a boarding school. In 1836 he moved to Dukinfield; in 1858 to Hackney. He took up the editorship of the "Christian Reformer" on his father's death, 1845 (keeping it till the publication ceased in 1863). In 1846 he was made one of the secretaries of Manchester College (holding the post till 1857). In 1850 he collected from the "Christian Reformer" memoirs of his father's life. Some smaller publications also came from his pen. A "Brief Memoir of the Rev.Paul Cardale", extracted from the "Christian Reformer", 1852; some Sermons and the "Unitarian Confession", 1858; and Mr.Richard Frankland and Dr.Henry Sampson's reprinted in pamphlet form, 1862.

	EXTRACT FROM BOOK ("A History of Hyde & its Neighbourhood"): The Rev. Robert Brook Aspland, M.A., son of the last-named Robert, was born in Newport, Isle of Wight, January 19th, 1805, and took his degree at Glasgow University in 1822. His first ministry began at Crook's Lane, Chester, in 1826. In 1833 he went to Bristol, and in 1837 to Dukinfield Old Chapel. Later he removed to Hackney to the church where his father had ministered for forty years. For nineteen years he edited the Christian Reformer, succeeding to the editorship on the death of his father in 1845. He died June 21st, 1869. The Rev. Robert Brook Aspland married, on October 21st, 1833, Jane, daughter of Randal Hibbert Esq., of Brookside, Godley, by whom he had issue, Arthur Palmer Aspland, and, Lindsey Middleton Aspland, who became a famous Queen's Counsel.
