The BARWICK Family

“Coxwold Publican”

The Barwick name first appears in our ancestry at the 4th generation, where our GG-Grandmother (and mother to William Robert Smith) was **Mary Barwick**, wife of **William Smith**. The Barwick name had been established within the parish of Coxwold for at least the preceding 200 years.

Thomas Barwick (b.1679)

Our earliest known Barwick ancestor was Thomas Barwick (our 7G-Grandfather) who was born in 1679 in Coxwold, North Yorkshire. Nothing is known of his wife, although there are records of 9 Children :

Nothing further is known of the above family, apart from ...

George Barwick (b.1708)

George Barwick was our 6G-Grandfather and was born in Coxwold, North Yorkshire in 1708, the son of Thomas Barwick of Coxwold. George was a Farmer and his wife was called Mary. Both were Catholics and they produced 6 children :

William Barwick (b.1742)

William Barwick was our 5G-Grandfather and was born in Coxwold, North Yorkshire in 1742, the son of George Barwick, a farmer in Coxwold. In 1769 he married **Elizabeth Plummer** in Coxwold. Elizabeth was about 19 years of age, having been born about 1750. She died in 1830 at 80 years of age and is buried in Coxwold churchyard.

William and Elizabeth produced 5 children :

Margaret Barwick (b.1789) married William Abbey at Coxwold in 1819. Nothing is known of the other children of William & Elizabeth, apart from ...

William Barwick (1782 - 1842)

Our GGGG-Grandfather was William Barwick, born in Coxwold, North Yorkshire in 1782, the oldest son of William Barwick and Elizabeth Plummer of Coxwold.

In 1820, he married **Mary Scaife** at Kilburn, North Yorkshire. She was born in 1789 at Oldstead, one of 10 children of **Francis Scaife** and **Ann Foster**. Francis was a carpenter in Oldstead.

William Barwick was the victualler at the public house in Coxwold, situated opposite the church. This was originally known as the Belayse Arms and he is listed in the trade directories of 1823 and 1840. Sometime before 1840 it was renamed to the Fauconberg Arms and it retains that name to this day. William died on 9th Nov 1842 aged 59 years and he is buried in Coxwold churchyard.

Mary survived him by a further 27 years. In 1861 she was living at New Cottage, Newburgh (adjacent to Coxwold) and with her are two of her granddaughters, Annie & Louisa Smith, aged 7 & 5 respectively, the daughters of William Smith and Mary. She died on 14th Dec 1869 aged 80 years and is buried in the same grave as William.

William Barwick and Mary produced 4 children :

Elizabeth Barwick	b.1821, at Coxwold, North Yorkshire
Ann Barwick	b.1823, at Coxwold, North Yorkshire
William Francis Barwick	b.1826, at Coxwold, North Yorkshire
Mary Barwick	b.1828, at Coxwold, North Yorkshire

Elizabeth Barwick (b.1821) was just over 2 years old when she died in 1824.

Ann Barwick (b.1823) married **George Smith** at Coxwold on 20th Apr 1854. As far as we aware, George was not related to any of our other Smith ancestors in Coxwold as he was born on 20th May 1814 at Bridlington, Yorkshire. George worked as a Land Agent for Sir George Wombwell on the Newburgh Estate, but in 1851 he had been a Land Surveyor in Oulston, so he probably moved to Newburgh some time during the early 1850s. Ann & George never had any children of their own, but **Eliza Jane Smith** (the oldest daughter of Ann's sister, Mary Barwick) lived with them at Newburgh from

when she was a teenager and continued to live with them for the rest of their lives. Ann, George and Eliza Jane moved from Newburgh in the early 1880s and went to live at Cliff House, Cliff Terrace, Filey, North Yorkshire. George died there in 1886.

In the 1891 census, Ann & Eliza Jane were living at Cliff House and with them is Ann's 21 year-old niece, Lucy Barwick, the daughter of Ann's brother, William Francis Barwick. Ann died at Cliff House in March 1895. Eliza Jane continued to occupy Cliff House until her own death in 1948.

William Francis Barwick (b.1826) married **Ann Foster** of Skiplam, North Yorkshire on 12th Jul 1855. Their first two children were born at Coxwold, but by 1860 they had relocated to Skiplam, where most of their remaining children were born.

In the 1871 census, William Francis Barwick is recorded at Lund Head Farm, Skiplam with his wife, 9 children and servants, where he is described as a Landowner and Farmer. In the early 1870s, they moved to Scarborough, North Yorkshire and his wife Ann died there about 1874, followed by William Francis about 1879.

Altogether William Francis & Ann had 10 children :

John Foster Barwick was living at Lund Villa, Westbourne Park, Falsgrave, York in 1881, aged 25 years and farming 112 acres. By 1901, he was a Master Stabler, living with his wife and 7 children at 16 The Crescent, Filey, North Yorkshire.

William Francis Barwick was living at Highfield, Falsgrave, York in 1881 along with 5 of his brothers & sisters.

Ann Elizabeth Barwick was living at Highfield, Falsgrave, York in 1881 along with 5 of her brothers & sisters.

Frederick George Barwick was living at 22 Coney St, York St. Martin Le Grand, York in 1881, working as an apprentice watchmaker & jeweller.

Emmaline Barwick - no information is available about her.

Henry Robert Barwick was living at Highfield, Falsgrave, York in 1881 along with 5 of his brothers & sisters and at that time he was working as a solicitor's clerk. He married Mabel Haworth in Filey in 1895. At that time he was described as a solicitor's clerk, of Norwood Lodge, Scarborough. This was considered an important event at the time and there were lengthy reports of it in 3 newspapers.

Maude Mary Barwick was living at Highfield, Falsgrave, York in 1881 along with 5 of her brothers & sisters.

Charles Barwick was living at Highfield, Falsgrave, York in 1881 along with 5 of his brothers & sisters.

Sidney Edwin Barwick was living at Highfield, Falsgrave, York in 1881 along with 5 of his brothers & sisters and is believed to have married in Scarborough in 1893.

Lucy Helen Barwick was born in Nawton and was living at a school at Jesmond Lodge, Norton in Malton, Yorkshire in 1881 and was living with Ann Smith (nee Barwick) at Cliff House, Cliff Terrace, Filey in 1891. She believed to have married in Scarborough in 1893.

Mary Barwick (b.1828) is our GG-Grandmother. She was born on 6th Jul 1828 at Coxwold and married **William Smith** (son of Robert Smith, Farmer of Coxwold) at St. Crux, York on 2nd Mar 1850. Soon after this, William took the family to Liverpool where they lived for a couple of years at 45 Great George Street. Their first two children were born in Liverpool.

Around 1853 they returned to Coxwold and William took on the role of Station Master, with the family living at Station House at Coxwold Railway Station. They lived here until the death of William on 26th Jul 1887 at the age of 74.

Mary then relocated to York and in 1891 she was living with her daughter Ann and son Charles Edwin at 29 Bishopthorpe Road. By 1901 she had moved to 33 Bishopthorpe Road with her spinster daughter Ann, although by that time Charles Edwin had married and moved to another address. Mary died on 19th Mar 1904 and was buried at Coxwold with her husband William.

William and Mary had 9 children :
