DETAILS OF WEDDING:

On 24th April 1895, Henry Robert BARWICK, 31, batchelor, solicitor's clerk of Scarborough, son of William Francis BARWICK deceased, married Mabel HAWORTH, 27, spinster of Filey, daughter of James HAWORTH, surgeon (transcribed from Filey parish church records). There are 3 newspaper reports of this important event.

Mr Barwick of Norwood Lodge, Scarborough, was the nephew of Mrs Smith of Cliff House, Filey. She had just died and so everyone was in mourning. The bride was wearing grey and jet and the bridesmaids were in brown with black hats - the whole affair being quiet. The 'large number of costly presents' are enumerated at great length and reveal some of who was who in the family. From the groom's side, there are many BARWICKs, a SCAIFE and some more SMITHs.

From the bride's side of the family, there are Haworths, Claytons, Hutchinsons, Coopers, and Smiths of Accrington.

FAMILY SCANDAL:

In 1905 Henry was made an executor of his father-in-law's Will and a trustee of the estate and in 1907 of his mother-in-law's estate. (She was living with them by then and died with them in Scarborough in 1912). In James Haworth's Will Douglas was given a gold pen and pencil set, a silver pencil case and all his books apart from the medical ones. His sister got nothing as did many of the other grandchildren - there were only a few had named bequests.

The story in the family is that Henry, as trustee of the estates, embezzled the funds thus leaving the two children whose inheritance was a monthly allowance from the estate, with nothing. This came to light in the 1920's and apparently made the 'News of The World'. It could be, of course, that Henry just made some bad investments and got caught up in the Depression. However, while Jane was living with them she made some increasingly vicious codicils to her Will and just about disinherited one of her sons. She well may have had provocation - the boys were 'drop-outs' in our terms - neither completed their medical studies. There was deep resentment in the remaining members of the family who were left in very reduced circumstances.
