

The BROUGHTON Family

My mother's maiden name was BROUGHTON and it is therefore central to my ancestry. My memories of the Broughtons are that it was a Hull-based family. However, research has shown that the family originated in an area to the west of Leeds in West Yorkshire. The earliest known member of my Broughton lineage was:-

John Broughton (b.circa 1780)

John Broughton was my 4G-Grandfather. He was born around 1780 and married **Elizabeth** (surname unknown). I'm not sure how many children they had, but one of them was my 3G-Grandfather, George Broughton.

George Broughton (b.1806)

George Broughton was my 3G-Grandfather. He was born in 1806 in Gomersal, West Yorkshire. He was clearly a literate and numerate person as he became a book-keeper - an occupation with which he continued for the rest of his working life. In the early/mid 1830s, he married **Sarah Brewerton** and they had 6 children (all boys) :-

1881 - 4 Hilary Place, Leeds, Yorkshire (George was living with wife & son)

There are no records of George Broughton (b.1806) and Sarah (nee Brewerton) in the 1891 census, so presumably they died at some time between 1881 and 1891.

James Broughton (b.circa 1835) did not marry. He obviously had a flair for music. At the age of 17 he was living at the home of Richard Browne, a Roman Catholic priest, at 19 Cookridge Street, Leeds and he was working as an organist in the church. By the age of 27, he was considered to be a Professor of Music and was later conductor of the Leeds Philarmonic. By 1881 he appeared in the census as follows:-

James Broughton died on 12th March 1887, aged about 52. After his death, the contents of his house were sold by auction and there were so many items that the sale spanned 4 days. His obituary was published in the *Leeds Mercury* newspaper dated 15th March 1887 and read:

"He was born near Dewsbury and the family moved to Leeds when he was 13. He was the Organist at St.Ann's RC Church and later at Leeds Grammar School chapel. He became the conductor of the Leeds Philarmonic Chorus and Bradford Festival Chorus. Every year he would arrange and conduct a series of concerts at the Queens Hotel, Leeds. James was best known as the Chorus Master for Leeds Music Festival from 1874 to 1883. His brother, Alfred Broughton subsequently took over as conductor and chorus master to the Leeds Philharmonic. Because of ill health (a chest infection) he went to South Africa in 1883 and whilst there he collected many art items with which his house in Leeds was adorned. He also travelled to New Zealand. His funeral took place at St.Matthews Church, Chapeltown, Leeds".

Thomas Broughton (b.circa 1837) appeared in the 1841 census as a 4-year-old child, but does not appear in any of the subsequent census records, so it is possible that he died as a child.

Henry Broughton (b.circa 1839) was my GG-Grandfather (further details below).

George Broughton (b.circa 1843) became an apprentice to a doctor and in 1861, when he was about 17, he was living at the home of Peter Thornton, GP Surgeon, at 528 Church Street, Dewsbury. I have no further information on George and do not know whether he married or had children.

William Brewerton Broughton (b.circa 1845) also never married. He joined the church and in 1871 he was a Theological Attendant. By 1881 he was the Curate of Sherburn and in 1891 he had become a Clerk in Holy Orders. He died in 1898 in

Scarborough, North Yorkshire.

Clara, living with William in the 1891 census, was the daughter of his brother, Henry Broughton.

Alfred Broughton (b.circa 1853) also had a musical flair and following the death of his older brother, he succeeded James as conductor and chorus master to the Leeds Philharmonic. In September 1880, he married **Sarah Greenwood** in Bramley, Leeds, West Yorkshire. They had 4 children:-

Henry Broughton (b.circa 1839)

Henry Broughton was my GG-Grandfather. He was born about 1839 in Batley, West Yorkshire, the 3rd son of George Broughton and Sarah (nee Brewerton). He married my GG-Grandmother, **Ann Shay**, in Pontefract, West Yorkshire in June 1860. They had 7 children:-

Edith A.Broughton (b.circa 1861) worked as a wool comber.

Francis G.Broughton (b.circa 1863) worked as a velvet gaser.

Clara Louisa Broughton (b.circa 1866) married Hugh Hall in Dec 1891 in Leeds.

Henry Herbert Broughton (b.circa 1869) was my G-Grandfather (see details below).

Alfred E.Broughton (b.circa 1871) worked as a chemical maker.

It appears that **Ann Broughton** (nee Shay) must have died at some point between 1881 & 1891 (probably in her 30s), as Henry was described as a widower in 1891. It is also interesting that at some times Henry would describe himself as a cabinet maker/joiner, and at other times, a teacher of music. Obviously, this was a very musical family with three brothers engaged in the teaching of music to others.

Henry Herbert Broughton (b.circa 1869)

Henry Herbert Broughton was my G-Grandfather. He was the third son of Henry Broughton and Ann (nee Shay). He moved to Hull and became a fisherman. Henry Herbert married **Mary Ann Cavanaugh**, the daughter of John Cavanaugh and Eliza. They had 9 Children:-

The above right photograph of Henry Herbert Broughton & Mary Ann shows 5 of the children.

Given that my Grandfather was the oldest child in the family and the two children that followed him were Beatrice & Gertrude, it could probably be assumed that the photo was taken about 1901/2.

The boy in the photograph would therefore be my Grandfather, Henry Herbert Broughton (b.1894).

The two older girls would be **Beatrice Broughton** & **Gertrude Broughton**.

Henry Herbert Broughton (b.1894) was my Grandfather (further details below).

Beatrice Broughton (b.circa 1895) married Arthur Leach. They had 3 children: Alan Leach, Arthur Leach and Mary Sheila Leach.

Gertrude Broughton (b.circa 1896) married Jack Payne.

Cyril Broughton married Mary Waterhouse. He worked as a rigger on the R100 airship and emigrated to Canada.

Given that Henry Herbert was a fisherman, as was Mary Ann's father (John Cavanaugh), perhaps this was the link between the two families and the reason that the couple met. Mary Ann Broughton (nee Cavanaugh) died in 1917.

Henry Herbert Broughton (1894-1934)

Henry Herbert Broughton was my Grandfather and was born in Hull on 19th May 1894, probably at 8 Sarah's Terrace, Rosamund Street. (This was the family home in 1901 and he continued to live there until his marriage in 1915). He died before I was born, so I never knew him.

On 25th April 1915, he married my Grandmother, **Ada Patterson**, at St.Barnabus Church, Hull. This was the year after the outbreak of World War I, so he was probably a soldier at the time. Ada always called him "Bert". In the war, Bert became a gunner and served in France.

Bert & Ada had 4 children:-

The first child, **Henry Herbert Broughton (b.1915)** died as an infant when he was less than three months old.

Herbert Dennis Broughton (b.1919) worked as a sail-maker. At the outbreak of World War II, he joined the navy. Unfortunately, his ship was sunk and Dennis was lost in action at sea on 3rd November 1941, shortly after his 21st birthday.

Arthur Broughton (b.1921) was also an infant mortality and died when he was less than 6 months of age.

Gladys Jean Broughton (b.1924) was my mother (see details below).

At the time of their marriage (1915), Bert & Ada were living at 19 Boynton Street, Hull. All their children were born there. They later moved to Walcott Street, but by the beginning of the 1930s, they were settled at 1 Providence Grove, Hawthorn Avenue. This was the address I knew throughout my childhood.

After returning from the War, Bert worked as a Waterman (probably on barges on the River Hull and/or River Humber). Although I have no real evidence, I got the impression that Bert was never in good health in the post-war years after WWI. Photographs of him during this period certainly do not give the impression of a healthy man. I don't know whether this was as a result of injury during the war or as a result of illness afterwards. However, he died on 7th June 1934 when he had just reached the age of 40. He is buried in Western Cemetary in Hull.

Gladys Jean Broughton (1924-1966)

Gladys Jean Broughton, was known as "Jean", and was my mother. She was born on 17th March 1924, the youngest child of **Henry Herbert Broughton** and **Ada** (nee Patterson). At the time of her birth, her parents were living at 19 Boynton Street, Hull.

After World War II, Jean met my dad, **Ronald James Woodhouse**. They married on 26th March 1949 at All Saints Church, Hessle.

In late 1966, Jean was admitted to Hull Royal Infirmary for exploratory treatment relating to stomach pains. Unfortunately, whilst she was in hospital, she had circulation problems and died from thrombosis on 6th December 1966.

She was 42 years old when she died. I was just 14 years old. Jean is buried in Tranby Croft Cemetary in Anlaby.
