Comment from Steve Morgan:-

James Stephenson was probably the father of all Jane's children even though there was only one Order against him (Common Law husband). If he was bound to pay for the first child at the Quarter Sessions, then a verbal promise before the Overseers to the Poor would be enough for the rest of the children. Jane would have had to have presented the children to the Overseers, so the Court Records may have details.
